We can all plan our giving back to God.



Those who pay Income Tax can increase the value of their planned giving by completing the Gift Aid Declaration. Please note the comments on the rear panel of this leaflet.

Thank you for planning your giving.

NOTE: Please notify the Treasurer if you: want to cancel this declaration; change your name or home address; no longer pay sufficient tax on your income and/or capital gains. Gift Aid is linked to basic rate tax, currently 20%, which currently allows charities to reclaim 25 pence in the pound.

Higher rate taxpayers can claim back the difference between basic rate and higher rate or additional rate tax. If you pay Income Tax at the higher or additional rate and want to receive the additional tax relief due to you, you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your Self Assessment tax return or ask HM Revenue and Customs to adjust your tax code.
